## Woven Filet Mesh Lap Throw

A gorgeous plaid woven filet mesh lap throw.



### Materials List:

#### Yarn

4 skeins Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn (100% acrylic, 3.5oz [100g], 170yd [156m])  
in color 110 Navy

4 skeins Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn (100% acrylic, 3.5oz [100g], 170yd [156m])  
in color 130 Honey

#### Hooks & Notions

US J-10 (6mm)

#### Gauge

2 boxes = 1" (2.5cm)

#### Finished Measurement

36" x 29" (91.5cm x 73.5cm) Without Fringe

Chain 158

Row 1: Dc in 6<sup>th</sup> ch from hook, \*ch 1, skip next ch, dc in next ch; repeat from \* across.

Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as first dc, and ch-1 sp), dc in next dc, \*ch 1, skip next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; repeat from \* across to the turning ch, ch 1, dc in the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of the turning ch.

Repeat Row 2 to create a filet mesh until desired rows are completed. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

### Design Color Pattern:

Rows 1 – 12: Honey

Rows 13 – 24: Navy

Rows 25 – 36: Honey

Rows 37 – 48: Navy

Rows 49 – 60: Honey

Rows 61 – 72: Navy

Rows 73 – 84: Honey

Turn filet mesh so rows are running perpendicular instead of side to side. Weave 6 strands of yarn (enough strands to comfortably fill boxes) through the mesh, alternating over and under filet mesh posts. Next row's woven pattern is the opposite of the previous row. Woven row colors should be the same as Design Color Pattern above. (For a demonstration watch video: How to Weave a Basic Filet Mesh.)

Fringe Optional: Add strands of yarn to fringe edge for bulkier fringe. (For a demonstration watch video: How to Make a Tassel.)
